
The Link & Ingede are out now!

An article on foliar application of nutrients by SASRI's Senior Soil Scientist Louis Titshall suggests that there may be positive crop responses to foliar feeding particularly where deficiencies are present.

Soil Scientists Drs Rianto Van Antwerpen and Thandile Mdlambuzi discuss soil sodicity and salinity and highlight ways growers can reverse negative impacts.

We also have articles on optimal fertiliser usage and our Fertiliser Advisory Service. The edition ends with a summary of recent weather events and a look forward into the likely weather scenario for the rest of 2022.
