## JUNIOR CERTIFICATE COURSE IN SUGARCANE AGRICULTURE

### APRIL 2019 COURSE DETAILS AND APPLICATION FORM 01 April – 18 April 2019

This three week course in sugarcane agriculture is held at the Kwa-Shukela building of the South African Sugar Association (SASA) offices in Mount Edgecombe. The course is held once or twice each year, usually in April and October, numbers permitting.

#### Entry Requirements

The general entry requirement is Std 10 (Grade 12), preferably from an agricultural school with at least two years on-farm experience.

A student who has a Std 8 (Grade 10) and relevant agricultural experience will be considered, depending on the outcome of an assessment and interview process.

**The course and assessments are conducted in English and therefore requires that applicants be able to read, write and understand English.**

#### Costs for 2019

This cost includes stationery (pen, pencil, ruler, eraser and calculator), course notes, SASRI Information Sheets, manuals, teas and excursion costs. Applicants should bring their own notebooks or writing pads. **This cost includes TUITION only – no meals are included.**

#### Application Information

Applications must be made on the official course application form (see page 4).

The closing date for applications is **20 December 2018**. NB: Since we experience very high application numbers, places on the course may be depleted before this closure date.

### **Course Structure and Content**

The duration of the course is three weeks and comprises both lectures and practicals. Each day commences at 08:00 and finishes at approximately 15:30. There are 10 minute intervals between lectures and a mid-morning tea break of 20 minutes. Tea and coffee is provided. The lunch break is from 13:00-13:40.

### **Course Assessment**

Tests are written after completion of each subject. The duration of tests are approximately one to two hours. Certificates are awarded in three classes namely:
